Video-based learning preferences have surged 22% year-overyear. Also, clinicians who attend in-person conferences plan to maintain or increase their attendance in 2025.



Four Critical Findings That Will Transform Your CME Strategy

Key Finding #1: Video-Based Learning Dominance

71% prefer video-based webcasts (up from 58% in 2024)—the clear winner among on-demand formats, significantly outpacing **podcasts (42%)** and other formats. This represents the largest year-over-year preference shift in our survey history.

Critical Insight: Your organization needs a robust video-based learning platform to meet clinician expectations.

Key Finding #2: The 30-60 Minute Sweet Spot

46% prefer 30-minute sessions, 31% prefer 60-minute sessions for on-demand learning. For live education, 43% want 60-minute presentations—long enough for depth, short enough for busy schedules

Critical Insight: Bite-sized, focused learning wins over lengthy training sessions.

- Complex Medical Issues (39%)

- Pharmacology (30%)

Key Finding #4: The Multi-Modal Imperative

Critical Insight: Your clinicians aren't choosing one format—they're using multiple learning modalities. Organizations providing only one type of CME are missing 60-70% of learning preferences.

- Al in Healthcare (43%) Top emerging topic request
- Wound Care (40%) High interest, limited offerings
- **Urgent Care Medicine** 23% interest, significant growth

Understanding Course Format Gaps

- Patient Case-Based Learning increased from 46% to 62% preference
- Simulation-Based Activities preferred by 33%, but rarely offered
- Traditional lectures alone no longer sufficient—78% want topic-driven presentations WITH case integration
